

What is recreational angling?

Angling is the catching of fish with rod, hook and line. Recreational angling is non-commercial rod and line fishing. The sale of fish caught in recreational fisheries is forbidden by EU law.

EAA Mission Statement:

« To safeguard the fish stocks and fisheries of Europe, and to protect the interests of all those who fish with rod and line for recreational purposes »

The European Anglers Alliance (EAA) is an NGO registered as a notfor-profit organisation. It counts about 3 million anglers affiliated to its 14 member organisations (2014) from 13 European countries.

Recreational angling is a sustainable activity generating economic activity and jobs in rural, remote and coastal areas;
